

## **URGENT CARE CONDITIONS**

Get help immediately for a child with any of the following conditions:

- Unconscious
- Not breathing
- No pulse
- Specific fevers



- A baby less than four months of age has a temperature of 100° F or higher under the armpit (Auxiliary)
- A temperature of 105° F or higher in a child of any age
- A child who has a temperature of more than 100° F under the armpit (Auxiliary) who is difficult to wake
- For infants under 4 months, forceful vomiting more than once
- Uncontrolled bleeding
- Burns
- Extreme tiredness
- Looking or acting very ill or getting worse quickly
- Neck pain when the child's head is moved or touched
- A stiff neck or severe headache and looking very sick
- Seizure
- Acting unusually confused
- Unequal pupils (black center of the eye) 
- A blood red or purple rash made up of pinhead-sized spots or bruises that are not associated with injury
- A rash of hives or welts that appears and spreads quickly

# URGENT CARE CONDITIONS continued

- Breathing so fast or so hard that the child cannot play, talk, cry or drink
- Sore throat with difficulty breathing and swallowing
- A severe, painful stomachache
- A stomachache without vomiting or diarrhea after a recent injury, blow to the stomach or hard fall
- Stools that are black or have blood in them
- Not urinating at least once in 8 hours, a dry mouth, no tears or sunken eyes or soft spot
- Continuous clear drainage from the nose after a hard blow to the head
- Vomiting with headache, fever and/or stiff neck
- Severe coughing, high pitched wheezing, or difficulty breathing
- Poisoning
